Do you *REALLY* believe in the Second Coming of Christ?

On this 33rd Sunday of the Year, the Word of God leans toward the soon-to-arrive Advent Season in a few weeks. All three readings spotlight the events of the end of the world and the Second Coming of Christ. That Coming is one of his three comings highlighted in Advent.

We hear today from the last Old Testament Prophet, Malachi, who preached about 420 B.C., calling the wayward Jewish people to faithfulness to God and more authentic worship. He drew attention to the "Messenger" ("Malachi" in Hebrew) who would prepare the Day of the Lord. It would be at once a time of judgment ("all evildoers will be stubble") and a promise of future redemption ("there will arise the sun of justice with its healing rays").

In a second letter to the Thessalonians, Paul addresses the misconduct of some within their community as they await the Second Coming of Christ. Although the hour was unknown, there was a high expectation that Jesus would return very soon, even in their own lifetimes. Paul decries the fact that people stopped working because they believed the end was near. That was no way to greet the returning Lord. Paul calls on them to imitate him, not acting "in a disorderly way," but working "in toil and drudgery, night and day," refusing to be a burden to others like someone always expecting a "free lunch."

In the reading from Luke's Gospel, Jesus addresses the eventual destruction of the Temple in Jerusalem. By the time the first Christians were reading Luke's Gospel, it had already been destroyed by the Romans in 70 A.D. That happening was meant to remind them of Jesus' Second Coming, a time of both judgment and grace for all humanity. It would be the big moment when Christ would save all and bring about the New Creation. It would be preceded by chaos—familial, national, international, and cosmic. Christians would be particular targets of persecution as bearers of the message. Jesus encourages them to persevere in giving testimony to him. "Not a hair on your head," he assures them, "will be destroyed."

The question of the week is this: If you really believe in Jesus' Second Coming, *really* believe, how would it affect your lifestyle?
