Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed

What happens to people when they die? This Sunday of the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed gives us an answer.

Our Catholic faith reflects Jewish tradition. The first reading from Wisdom speaks about the death of the just Israelite. The book was written in later Old Testament times and demonstrates an evolution of Jewish insight into death. Earlier writings speak of the deceased going to a place called Sheol, a shadowy underworld where all the dead resided, regardless of how they lived. Sometime later, Jews began to believe in eternal resurrection to either reward or punishment. Closer to the time of Christ, they generally accepted the immortality of the soul and general resurrection.

The Book of Wisdom expresses these later beliefs. Jewish souls of the "just," people of holy lives who have been "proven like gold in the furnace," and are in the hands of God at death. Forever, they "shall shine, and shall dart about as sparks through stubble . . . their hope full of immortality."

The Letter to the Romans speaks of hope. Christians see themselves as sinners beloved of God for whom Christ died, implying an eternal salvation for them after death.

In John's Gospel, Jesus teaches that he does not reject anyone who comes to him. Such believers are given to Christ by the Father, and Christ will raise them on the last day. For it is the will of the Father that people of faith never be lost to Christ.

"All Souls Day," after "All Saints Day," expresses Catholic belief in purgatory, a period of final cleansing for faithful souls who died in God's grace but still need purification before entering heaven. It affirms faith in the community of all the faithful, who can help one another on their way to God in life and in death.

This day is a time of prayer for our loved ones and all who have died in Christ. We offer Masses for them, visit their graves, light candles in church and at home, give alms, and do other works of charity in their memory.

May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed rest in peace!
